Polyn: tiki, tikitiki

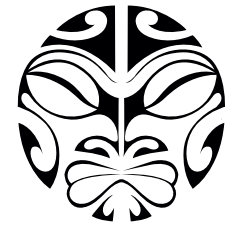
Symbols: tiki can be a protector in principle or a help in many specific areas of life.

Symbols: magic, freedom, lightness candid and carefree spirit



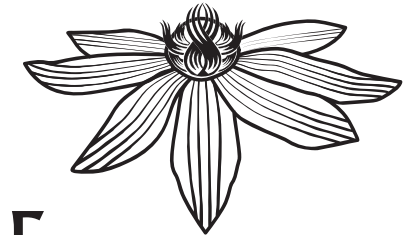
## KORU
